# **COURSE INTRODUCTION**

In A Level Art & Photography, we attempt to flood our young creative practitioner's world with experiences that require them to see and think in new ways, taking risks in a safe and supportive working environment. We recognise and celebrate the diversity of the young people we work with, their personalities, experiences of life, interests, and artistic abilities. You will be strongly encouraged to express your natural curiosity in the knowledge and confidence that your contribution will be highly valued.

You will study historical and contemporary Art and Photography practices within a stimulating and challenging environment, while we teach you how to undertake complex and ambitious creative tasks covering a broad range of progression skills including Creative Thinking, Communication Skills, Cultural Awareness, Presenting Your Work, Observational Studies, Material Exploration, Practical Experimentation, Research, and Independent Study Skills.

The curriculum is designed to be challenging to build resilience and stretch students to build their full potential while enjoying their studies. Throughout the course you will be encouraged to research and experiment with different specialisms within Art & Photography, including fine art, photography, film making, animation, graphics, 3D and fashion textiles.
