With the GCSE exam period running from Thursday 9th May - Wednesday 26th June, it is imperative that we ensure the final months are as productive as possible. To this end, there are several key points we, as the Year 11 team, would like to emphasise to you, to aid in our support of the Year 11 students.

Attendance and Punctuality

In the remaining months of Year 11, it is imperative that all Year 11 students are in school every day and arrive to school on time. Attendance is directly linked to attainment, and students missing any days off school risk achieving lower grades in their GCSEs.

Subject Interventions

Department areas have recently launched their Period 6 intervention lessons after school, to help students catch up on missed work, and help prepare them for their exams. For some of our students, these intervention sessions are mandatory, however, all intervention sessions are open to all Year 11 students, regardless of current attainment. Please familiarise yourself with the intervention timetable below and encourage all students to attend intervention sessions in key subjects that they require support with.
