Visit to Woman in Black - Years 10 and 11

I am writing to inform you about an exciting opportunity for students to see The Woman in Black at the Aylesbury Waterside Theatre on Wednesday 11th October as part of their study of drama. Students will watch a live performance and then go on to evaluate this live performance in their subsequent lessons.

Students will leave the school at 12:30 on Wednesday 11th October and travel by coach to and from the theatre, returning to school at 18:30. Students will be required to wear school uniform, including shoes (no trainers or jeans allowed). Students will require a packed lunch for this trip. Please note that the theatre does not accept cash payments, therefore if students would like to purchase drinks, snacks or a programme, they will need to use a bank card. Students will also require a note pad and pen, as they will be required to take notes both during the interval and on the way home.

If your child suffers from asthma or requires an EpiPen, it is your responsibility to ensure that the appropriate medication is provided for this trip.

Please note that there are a limited number of places available and these will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Only students with an exemplary record of behaviour will be eligible.

The cost of this trip is £35.00. If you would like your child to participate in this trip, please pay the non-refundable cost of £35.00 as soon as possible.

As the school no longer accepts cash or cheques, parents are asked to use ParentPay to pay for this trip. If you are unable to pay online, please contact the school office, who will provide a barcode letter to enable payment at a PayPoint, which is linked to your ParentPay account. If your child receives free school meals and payment should present a problem, please contact the finance team via email to finance@uhs.org.uk.

By consenting on ParentPay to this trip, you agree to:

- Your child taking part in the visit as detailed above;
- A member of staff giving consent for your child to receive appropriate medical treatment in the event of an emergency.
